#### ANZAC/REMEMBRANCE DAY BINGO Hints/Fun Facts/Brain Teasers

Use this information however you like to provide hints/information/ask questions and promote discussion and reminiscing among the residents while completing the Music Bingo.

I remind the residents that they may not know all of the songs but if they listen carefully, they can often pick the "hook line" (or most repeated word/phrase which is often the title of the song).

<u>ANZAC</u> – Australian and New Zealand Army Corps although it has come to include all those from the armed services and all wars which we have been involved in.

- 1. <u>God Save The King</u> King George V was the British monarch during WW1 and George V1 during WW2. When England declared war with Germany, Australia as a dominion of the British Empire, was automatically also at war.
- 2. <u>God Defend New Zealand</u> The New Zealand National anthem sung in Maori the first time through. The Maori word for New Zealand is Aotearoa and it is sung at the end of the first verse. It is not until the last line of the English verse that we hear the word New Zealand.
- 3. Abide With Me a hymn always sung at the ANZAC service.
- 4. Reveille a bugle call to wake personnel in the armed forces.
- 5. <u>The Last Post</u> signifies the end of the day's activities but also to indicate that a soldier has gone to his final resting place. It is also used at ANZAC day and Remembrance Day services.
- **6.** Wish Me Luck as You Wave Me Goodbye a song made popular by Gracie Fields during WW2 but also sung by Vera Lynn.
- 7. <u>It's A Long Way to Tipperary</u> originally written as a lament from an Irish worker in London missing his homeland before it became a popular marching song. This song was written in 1912 but became so popular that it is said that the Germans even sang it.
  - As the crow flies it is 17,365 Klms from Melbourne to Tipperary Ireland.
- 8. <u>Pack Up Your Troubles</u> 1915 Marching song. It is often combined with It's a Long Way to Tipperary.
- **9.** <u>Australia Will Be There</u> Written in 1915, Australia Will Be There was immensely popular. The song celebrates the nation's freedom and declares Australia's commitment to fight. It references the defeat of the German light cruiser SMS Emden by HMAS Sydney on 9 November 1914.

- 10. The Brown Slouch Hat The iconic brown slouch hat was first adopted into Australian military service in 1885 when it was chosen for the newly-formed Victorian Mounted Rifles; its well known high-domed crown and narrow brim, turned up on the left side, so that a rifle or one fitted with a bayonet would not interfere with the head gear, soon became symbolic of the Australian services. It was first worn overseas in the South African War. The song however was not written until 1942.
- 11. <u>K-K-K-Katy</u> Written in 1917, the song was published a year later and was advertised on sheet music as "The Sensational Stammering Song Success Sung by Soldiers and Sailors" and spread like wildfire via gramophone recordings, sheet music, and word of mouth. *K-K-K-Katy* became known as a 'goodbye song' and was sung from coast to coast, and by the Canadian, U.S. and British troops overseas. By 1921, *K-K-K-Katy* sold over 1.5 million copies of sheet music. It then became popular again during WW2.
- **12.** <u>Mademoiselles From Armentieres</u> a popular song during WW1 probably borrowed from the French.
- **13.** <u>If You Were the Only girl In the World</u> -a popular WW1 and WW2 song but also made popular later by Perry Como, Doris Day and Dean Martin among others.
- **14.** <u>Bless 'Em All</u> Subtitled the "Service Song" was made popular during both wars by George Formby.
- **15.** <u>Lilli Marlene</u> Lilli Marlene was originally a German poem written in 1915. The music was not written until 1937. It was an extremely popular song with the German and the Allies. Sometimes referred to a "Lilli of the Lamplight".
- **16.** <u>Waltzing Matilda</u> Waltzing Matilda is Australia's unofficial anthem. Written by Bango Paterson in the late 1880's. It became famous when used for a Billy Tea advertisement in 1903.
- 17. <u>Keep The Home Fires Burning</u> subtitled "Till the Boys Come Home", written in 1914. The song was an appeal for those at home during World War I to keep their heads up and keep their home fires burning while their hearts were yearning for their lads who were far away.
- **18.** <u>I Didn't Raise My Son to Be A Soldier</u> An anti-war song written in 1915. It became known in Australia and Britain and was associated with the American pacifist's movement before America joined the war.
- **19.** We'll Meet Again 1939 war song made famous by Vera Lynn.
- **20.** Oh, It's Lovely War somewhat satirical war song of 1917.

#### **Instructions for Music Bingo**

- 1. Each pack contains Dementia friendly 20 Music Bingo cards, Song List and Fun Fact/Hints/Brain Teasers list.
- 2. Locate specific Music Bingo on Spotify (Kurrajonglodge).
- 3. Connect to portable speaker.
- 4. Hand out music Bingo sheet and Bingo tokens.
- 5. Each card contains 8 songs although 20 songs will be played.
- 6. Each game should take approximately ½ hour.
- 7. Play 10-20 seconds of the song (or until the chorus has been sung as this usually contains the key word/s or phrase). Often the song will be recognised long before 10 seconds has been played.
- 8. Explain to the residents that they may not recognise the song but if they listen carefully, they should be able to pick up the title/keyword of the song. (If they don't recognise the song one of the other residents will know the song or you can tell them after hints etc).
- 9. You can give HINTS, FUN FACTS AND BRAIN TEASER'S (see folder) to entertain, add stimulation or assist to recognise the song. Sometimes this will provoke a discussion/reminiscing about the song so just go with the flow. Occasionally you might end up singing a verse or chorus.
- 10. When Bingo is reached ask the residents to choose one of their favourite songs from the card that they would like to hear all the way through. Play the song then redistribute the sheets and begin a new game.
  - IF YOU REPEAT A GAME PLAY THROUGH THE SONGS IN REVERSE.
- 11. At the end of the session wipe down all the cards with Clinell, spray bingo tokens with Glen 20 and return cards/fact sheets and song list to Bingo folder.
- 12. Return Music Bingo, tokens and portable speaker.
